## European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) and European Society for Clinical Microbiology and Infectious Diseases



[JULY 8] Out of the 31 EU and EFTA countries, 30 countries are reporting a total of 10,820 confirmed cases, including four deaths. In the past 24 hours, 238 new cases were confirmed from the EU and EFTA countries (Table1). Media report on a total of 7 deaths in the UK, four more than currently reported; confirmation from official sources is awaited before further updates are made.
